- **OBJECTION:** A good God would not allow evil and suffering.
- **ANSWER:** God has an ultimate purpose through evil and suffering.

1. the <u>brokenness</u> of this <u>world</u>. (Job 1:2-5)

2. <u>Satan's activity</u>. (Job 1:6-12)

**3.** the <u>purposes</u> of <u>God</u>. (Job 1:13-2:10)
